**...from Ken Rodmell.** Tonight, May 27, sees another pass from the ISS (International Space Station). It should become visible in the west at around 10.57pm, rising to an elevation of 33 degrees to the SSW at 11pm (*ed. followed by the SpaceX rocket - see below*) and fizzling out of view to the SSE at 18 degrees elevation shortly after - this last item being well worth watching, for the sunset (as seen from the ISS) takes a mere seven seconds! Data from the excellent 'Heavens Above' website (recommended). Planet Venus is rapidly 'catching -up' with the Sun, prior to inferior conjunction on June 4, but will still be visible for a day or so yet, shortly after sunset and very close to the western horizon, after which it will be lost to the sun's glare or afterglow before reappearing as the 'morning star' heralding sunrise.

DO NOT LOOK DIRECTLY AT THE SUN, WHETHER WITH BINOCULARS OR THE NAKED EYE.

If you enjoy a challenge, try seeking out Mercury. Start by using Venus as a signpost then slowly pan your binoculars in the 'half-past-ten' direction from there. Be patient - it's tiny but it's truly rewarding to witness something that even many professional astronomers have never seen!

There's a special bonus tonight, because, as the skies are forecast to be clear, we should also be able to see the The SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket which will lift off from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida around 9.33pm in the UK to join the ISS. The historic flight from SpaceX and NASA will see astronauts Robert Behnken and Douglas Hurley journey to the International Space Station on board the Crew Dragon spacecraft - and it will be the first crewed spaceflight from the US since the retirement of the Space Shuttle programme in 2011. It will also be the first time a private company has attempted to send astronauts into space.

**...from Powys Teaching Health Board.** If you have a persistent cough, high temperature or loss of taste & smell, you may have coronavirus. You must request a test as soon as possible. Tests are most effective when taken in the first 5 days of symptoms, so you should take this test as soon as you receive it. It's very important to follow the instructions for the test. Here's Jamie Roberts showing you how to take the test - watch this video in full first (at <https://youtu.be/3cuAzd2-ol>) before you begin the process. **...from Powys Teaching Health Board.** The latest update from the Office for National Statistics confirms that sadly 84 people from Powys have died with suspected or confirmed COVID-19. **...from Powys Recycles.** If you visit your local Recycling Centre, only one person may leave your vehicle to unload your waste and recycling, and staff are unable to help you unload any items, therefore please only take items you can carry yourself. Please segregate your waste before arriving to help keep your visit short.

n.b. You can only visit the HWRC if you have extra waste at home which cannot be collected through the normal kerbside collection service.

These are the rules: Do NOT visit the HWRC if you, or anyone in your household has coronavirus symptoms! Only cars will be allowed in - Initially, no trade permits, or commercial vehicles or trailers permits will be allowed in. Please be prepared to wait patiently in your car. Strict social distancing rules will be in place at all times. Only one person is allowed to leave the vehicle to unload - this means that you can only take

things that can be carried by one person. Please segregate your waste before arriving to help keep your visit short. Check our website for opening days, times and full details of HWRC rules: [www.powys.gov.uk/recycle](http://www.powys.gov.uk/recycle).

**...from the Fire Service.** The fire service is warning of the dangers which can be posed by disposable BBQs as they respond to a number of call outs. Over the bank holiday weekend Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service had to extinguish a number of disposable BBQs which were becoming dangerous. Please only BBQ where it's safe to do so - remember that everything is tinder dry at the moment - and remember to fully extinguish your BBQ when finished. Then take everything home with you - leave only footprints. Thank you!
