Bank Holiday Monday may not have been as sunny or warm this year, but that didn't put off the visitors pouring into Presteigne for the annual Food and Flower Festival. They strolled through streets lined with stalls, browsing, tasting and buying goods from artisan bakers and cheese makers, gourmet cake and chocolate makers, coffee roasters, speciality tea factors and a host of other passionate food and drink producers in our area. Local nurseries set out their stands in St Andrew's churchyard, filling it with spring colour. The church flung open its doors to visitors enjoying the beautiful floral decorations and performances by two choirs. Outside, buskers filled the streets with music. Seven private gardens opened their gates to visitors during the afternoon. Godwyn House in Broad Street was also be the venue for About Face Theatre's captivating performances of *Theatre for One*, inspired by local stories and performed throughout the afternoon. There were hot meals available all day in the food court, and families relaxed with tea and cakes in the lovely garden of the Old Rectory, while the kids enjoyed sack races, a treasure hunt, face painting and crafts. A willow weaving workshop and tempting recipes to make with locally brewed beer were all included in the programme for this happy and inspiring day. The swifts have started to arrive ! Ann says ".....please join 130,000 other concerned people and sign the 38Degrees petition to the Secretary of State for the Environment to "Legislate that all UK house builders shall install Swift Bricks in all new-build homes, and give incentives for retrofitting

nest boxes on older properties". This is the link: <u>https://you.38degrees.org.uk/petitions/save-our-swifts</u>. Why is this important? Swift numbers have declined across the UK by 53% between 1995 and 2016. By incorporating a Swift Brick in all new houses we can save these beautiful birds. On fine summer evenings Swifts gather in "low flying screaming parties" as they chase each other around the buildings where they nest. Because they rely on eating insects, swifts can only live in the UK for a short period in summer when insects are plentiful. Swifts migrate south to Africa in August and return to us in the following May.

Let's make sure we continue to have these incredible birds every summer.

There seems to be a rash - almost an avalanche of phishing emails this month - purporting to come from Apple, Amazon, Netflix saying your account has been suspended and, most recently, impersonating Royal Mail about a parcel that can't be delivered. Stay safe - don't respond or click on anything. If you know how, forward the email to each company's phish-reporting websites or otherwise, just delete !

This is clever! #Weee All medals at next summer's Olympics and Paralympics in Tokyo will be made from recycled electronic waste, including discarded smartphones, digital cameras and other handheld games and laptops. https://www.theguardian.com/sport/2019/feb/08/olympics-medals-recycled-gadgets-electronic-waste The organizing committee said municipal authorities had already collected 47,488 tons of junked devices by last November, roughly 19 months after the project was launched with targets of 30.3kg of gold, 4,100kg of silver and 2,700kg of bronze. The goal for bronze was reached in June, while more than 90% of the gold and 85% of the silver has been collected, officials said. It is estimated that the remaining amounts of metal required to manufacture all Olympic and Paralympic medals can be extracted from the devices already donated. BRILLIANT !!!
