An urgent plea from the Fire Brigade - please DO NOT PARK on the double-yellow lines by the Lloyds ATM (anywhere from the mini roundabout to past the Police Station!) as this has caused real problems on a number of occasions for the fire engine needing to get out onto Hereford Street. Even if you're only there for a few minutes using the ATM, if that corresponds with an urgent 'shout' for the fire brigade it could have serious consequences - and remember that double-yellow parking is illegal!!

DID YOU KNOW?

....the RBL Social Club hosts Slimming World every Wednesday, and the social club itself is open Friday & Saturday nights as well as lunchtime on a Sunday. ....there are special boxes in The Library and in Spar for collecting used batteries, which are taken by the European Recycling Forum. Household portable AA, AAA, C, D laptop & power tool batteries are all accepted, the only restriction is that they must be able to fit through the hole in the top of the collection box.

....(from Rolly) a while back someone offered unused hearing aid batteries on Freegle (which found a good home, which is great). An alternative would be to **drop them in to the Circle**, every Tuesday at the Youth Club in Hereford Street 9.30 - 1.30pm then they can be passed on to the monthly Hearing Clinic. Other batteries: buying rechargeable (extended life) if you have or can get a charger, is an even better option. Best make is Eneloop (with reuse and the environment in mind) sold by Panasonic or Fujitsu.

....the Library and St. Andrew's Church both collect used postage stamps for our Day Centre from where they are sold on to collectors to boost ERDC funds.
