Poster Competition: Pupils at Presteigne Primary School recently took part in a competition to design posters for the Town Council to use to encourage owners to pick up their dog poo and to discourage littering. Photo attached of the winning entries which will be made into signs for use on Town Council land.

Planning:.Town Councillors objected to the proposed new dwelling on land north of Clatterbrune, Presteigne for the following reasons –

- The height of the proposed dwelling in relation to adjacent single storey dwellings.
- The adverse effect on light to adjacent properties and overlooking/privacy for those properties.
- Dwelling sited too close to the boundary.
- Materials not in keeping with adjacent properties.
- Narrow access road with no pavements despite pavements being shown on the block plan.

Graffiti on Picnic Bench: Members were concerned to learn that a quantity of offensive graffiti had been drawn on a picnic bench in the 'beach' area of Went's Meadow. The police are now speaking to the offender and the bench has been sanded clean and re-oiled – thank you to Cllr. Rory Bennett for doing this so quickly.

Former Reservoir Ground, adjacent to Eddie's Meadow: New paths are being constructed to improve access to this area and information boards will be installed shortly. Thanks to Heather Lewis and Powys County Council for their help with this project.

CALLING ALL EARLY MUSICIANS AND SINGERS - a date for your diary in September when Early Music in the Marches 2019 presents:

A TWO-DAY WORKSHOP on Johann Caspar Kerll's settings of the Mass. 9.30 a.m.- 4.30 p.m., <u>Saturday, 28th and Sunday, 29th September</u> at Upper House and St Michael's, Discoed. This year David Allinson, director of Music at Christchurch University, Canterbury, will join our musical director, David Hatcher, in leading our weekend workshop. The settings will include the Missa Quasimodo, Missa in Fletu Solatium, Obsidionis Viennensis, Missa Pro Defunctis and the monumental Missa à Tré Chori. While we are again pleased to be welcoming students from the Northern College of Music to sing most of the solos, these can be shared if requested in advance. This year our numbers will also be swelled by instrumentalists from the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. There are parts for violin family members, viols, trombones, cornets, trumpets and a variety of wind and continuo instruments A=440. We plan to run the music through before we finish at 4.30p.m. on Sunday. Friends and family, as always, are welcome to squeeze in to listen.

Handel's so-called Twelve Grand Concertos are for a concertino trio of two violins and cello with ripieno (two violins, viola and continuo). They were published by John Walsh in 1739 and were available to buy by subscription. Within the collection, Handel gives full rein to his compositional styles including trio sonatas, operatic arias, French overtures, Italian sinfonias, airs, fugues etc. etc.!

Garden waste is collected every fortnight at the kerbside from April to November. If you currently receive an assisted collection, this will also include your kerbside garden waste collection.
