American émigré theme. The series is curated by film editor Tony Lawson who will introduce each film.

Friday August 23rd at 8pm NINOTCHKA (1939) Ernst Lubitsch

Starring Greta Garbo with music by Werner Heymann. *Ninotchka* is set in a Hollywood version of Paris, and the story tells of three hapless Soviets sent to sell jewels - and the woman who's sent to fetch them from the clutches of capitalism. The film can be seen as a romantic comedy or as anti Soviet propaganda, with lines like "The last mass trials were a great success...There are going to be fewer, but better, Russians." This event ends at approximately 10pm - Classification U

Saturday August 24th at 8pm THE BIG HEAT (1953) Fritz Lang

When Detective Dave Bannion (Glenn Ford) returns home to find his wife killed by a car bomb that was meant for him, he throws his badge away and sets out for revenge. The Big Heat is the story of a fight against crime and administrative corruption, the duality of human nature and man's capacity for both good and evil. Director Fritz Lang neither condemns nor condones, conveying only essential plot information, concentrating on action and its consequence. This event ends at approximately 9.45pm - Classification 15

Sunday August 25th at 8pm ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST (1975) Milo Forman

McMurphy (Jack Nicolson) is placed in a psychiatric ward for observation. His grinning, playful character brings chaos to the tyranny of order ruled over by Nurse Ratched. Is he a merry trickster or is he really ill? The film never answers the question, leaving us to puzzle where sanity lies. Directed by Miloš Forman, this story of a dissenting voice that is crushed is something that he would have understood well, having lived under an oppressive social system until 1968. This event ends at approximately 10.25pm - Classification 15

NOW IN ITS 3RD YEAR, PRESTEIGNE OPEN STUDIOS & EXHIBITIONS will be happening again in 2019 during the Presteigne Festival. Artists and makers of many different media will open their doors to the public from <u>Saturday 24th August to Monday 26th August, 11am-5pm.</u>

From furniture making to basketry, from ceramics to fine art, pretty much every field of artistic interest is covered. Most of the venues are within easy walking distance of the town centre, but Pete Smith will be demonstrating his blacksmithing skills at Bluefoot Forge in Stapleton, which although a little bit further out in the scenic hamlet of Stapleton, should be well worth a visit.

There will be a brochure available throughout town nearer the time, with a map showing the various venues, and the different media being demonstrated or displayed. All venues will be clearly signed. This year 27 artists will be taking part, showing the huge diversity of artistic talent here in Presteigne.

These are <u>not</u> accepted in your kerbside collection and until now you either had to take them to the Powys HWRC at Llandrindod Wells, or put in your wheelie bin to go to landfill. **The bank is only for** juice cartons, other beverage cartons, paper cups, milk cartons, paper coffee cups, and clean soup, tomato and other food cartons. **Please do NOT use it for** plastic or polystyrene cups, plastic/foil pouches, glass, paper, card, plastic bottles/bags, tins/cans, aerosols, foil, etc.

And another reminder that **you can take all crisp packets to No.46 Wine Bar who send them off for recycling producing funds for the Guide Dogs charity. Every little helps!**

A message from Lynne at the PNCS Warehouse....there has been an increase in the amount of items left outside the Warehouse door when we have been closed - including large items like old mattresses and furniture. PLEASE DON'T LEAVE ANYTHING THAT CAN'T FIT INTO THE COLLECTION BIN.

Items left outside are likely to get wet and then cannot be sold. It then costs us to have them taken away so such 'donations' are not helping but are actually costing us money. We do have notices asking people not to do this and have Council notices to warn about fly tipping.
