Presteigne's CHRISTMAS FAIR is back...on Friday 13th December...and it's bigger and better than ever! The Fair is jointly organised by CONNECT and St. Andrew's Church and will create a Winter Wonderland in and around the church and the church hall and yard. Starting at 3.30pm and running through to 7pm there will be food, drink and various gift stalls, plants, raffl es and draws, tombola, christmas trees, and entertainment from our own John Bray with his fi re show and circus equipment. Children can visit Santa in his Grotto in the church between 3.45 and 6.15pm; hot dogs and soup, or a glass of mulled wine and a mince pie will be served in the Church Hall where you will find even more stalls. The Community Café will be serving teas and coffees and there will be lots of opportunities to sing carols in the church. The children from the Primary School will be singing at 4pm to entertain you. It's good to know that we can look forward to 2020 with renewed optimism about the creation of a community facility for the benefit of Norton residents. The preferred name for the adapted building is St Andrews Community Hub we hope you approve. Work on renovating the building is unlikely get under way for several months and will require major grant funding. More details on the planning of the project will be available early in 2020. Before then, the Trust will need to secure the financial resources to maintain the church building, pay a range of advisory and professional fees, and purchase new chairs and tables to replace the redundant (and not very comfortable) pews. There's a COSTA coffee machine in Spar now using disposable cups - we checked with Costa (and with Powys CC) about recycling and they say that cups from the machine can be recycled along with paper waste. So no need to take them up to the ACE drinks carton recycling bins at the Bring Site, just pop them in your kerbside paper & card recycling box.

Presteigne now has a THIRD investment club - for green and ethical investments. Jonathan says "At the inaugural meeting, members agreed that a single difference between the new club and Presteigne's two existing clubs should be that only 'Green and Ethical' shares would be bought and sold. The advantages for supporting such companies, as their importance in our economy rises, could be significant. Unlike any other town of a comparable size – in the entire country! – Presteigne now has three active investment clubs. However, unlike the established (PIC) Presteigne and (MIC) Marches Investment Clubs, both of which have an extensive waiting list, at time of writing, the new investment club still has a few vacancies for new members before it, too, reaches the legal maximum of twenty and has to start its own waiting list. A message from the Council for the Protection of Rural Wales CPRW...."In December 2018, Powys CC stopped publishing any comments from "third parties" on their planning website - the Planning **Portal. This is completely unacceptable.** "Third parties" are Powys residents, other members of the public and environmental organisations. Consultee responses to planning applications are also frequently omitted. These representations often have important evidence for or against planning applications which should be taken into account. The third party comments show the extent and reasons for public concern or support. They should be available on the internet for EVERYONE, including Planning Committee Members, to see. The poor alternatives of viewing files in Llandrindod Wells or asking for public comments by email, penalises the public. This is simply not working. POWYS PEOPLE DESERVE A FAIR, TRANSPARENT PLANNING SYSTEM. The Town Council has been campaigning on this issue for some time with a report to the Welsh Local Government Association in September. Our Town Clerk, Tracey Price also wrote to the new Powys Portfolio Holder asking for a further Review on the matter. This Review has been held but Powys CC still say "no". Tracey is also in contact with the Powys Branch of Council Clerks to help spread the word with their Councils. If you agree this situation has to change please visit the CPRW (Campaign for the Protection of Rural Wales) website to sign this petition http://www.brecon-and-radnorcprw.wales/?page_id=1840. The petition is easy to sign and will help to show Powys CC the level of local support for this important issue and how we object to their decision to stop publishing all third party comments on the Council web-site".
