Just delete it.....and of course the daily emails trying to convince you that your Netfl ix or Amazon Prime subscriptions have expired. So many criminal chancers out there trying to steal our data or our money! If you have any suspicion at all, just forward the complete email as below then delete! How are the Supermarkets doing at tackling the plastic problem? Check out the @greenpeaceuk 2019 league table! <a href="https://www.greenpeace.org.uk/news/supermarket-plastic-rises-above-90000-tonnes-per-year-despite-plastic-reduction-pledges/">https://www.greenpeace.org.uk/news/supermarket-plastic-rises-above-900000-tonnes-per-year-despite-plastic-reduction-pledges/</a>. Findings from the Greenpeace UK report include: \*Waitrose and Morrisons were the best performers, while Asda and Aldi were bottom of the table. \*Iceland dropped from the top spot last year to seventh place this year. \*Sainsbury's went from bottom of the 2018 league table to third place this year. \*Eight supermarkets pumped out 58.3 billion pieces of plastic packaging. \*Other leading brands failed to respond to the survey for the second year running, including Ocado, Best-One and Booker Group. Waitrose scored highly because it had reduced the amount of plastic packaging used, and is looking to scale up innovative trials to offer refill stations in store for products like coffee, rice and pasta, as well as wine and detergent.

Morrisons became the first retailer to set a quantified target to increase reusable and refillable packaging. It also started its own refill trials, and made loose and refillable ranges 10% cheaper than packaged counterparts. After Greenpeace targeted Sainsbury's for its poor track record on plastics, it announced plans to reduce plastic by 50% and introduced reusable produce bags for loose fruit and vegetables. Companies at the bottom of the league table had increased their overall plastic footprint since last year and had generally made the least progress to date on trialling and expanding packaging-free and reusable solutions. **Seen in The Week...good news and going in the right direction!!** - Britain's woodland cover has returned to mediaeval levels thanks to the trends for 're-wilding' and recent tree-planting initiatives, public and private. Around 13% of the country, or about 3.19 million hectares, is now forested, according to the Forestry Commission. That represents 8% of Northern Ireland, 10% of England, 15% of Wales, and 19% of Scotland. In 1919, when the Forestry Commission was established, just 5% of Britain was covered with trees.

**NEWS FROM OUR TOWN COUNCIL**.....PCC are hoping to put the trial one-way system on Hereford Street (from the Lugg View junction to the Police Station car-park) in place soon, hopefully in January......following outline planning permission in 2018, the developer's architects explained that the forthcoming planning application for the land opposite to Kings Court is for 36 new dwellings of various sizes from 2 to 4 bedrooms. 30% of these would be affordable - 70% of those for sale and the remainder for rent-to-buy. Subject to planning permission, the intent is to commence the build in the summer (2020).
