On a more down-to-earth note, Powys CC has advised that Recycling and Refuse collections for Powys householders and the council's trade waste customers will be later than usual during Christmas and the New Year.

If your collection is due on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, it will take place as usual, but otherwise collections will take place two days later during Christmas week and then one day later during New Year week.

An original and arresting take on the age-old theme of lynch-mob anger, this time set in the Australian outback of the 1920s. An Aboriginal stockman kills a violent white landowner in selfdefence, an act that provokes self-righteous outrage within the racist local community and a 'string him up' manhunt. So far, so predictable. But director Warwick Thornton doesn't allow us our usual easy assumptions as this familiar plot-line plays out. First-rate ensemble performances, fabulous visuals, intriguing flash-forwards, taut plotting & satisfying prods at the film's moral ambiguities, lift this Western well clear of routine story-telling.
