Had you heard that Winnie's is closing on 31st March? The shop's been part of our High Street for so long and really will be missed. We wish you and your family well, Paul - and hope that someone will take it on soon!

Wondering what to do with your old plastic plant pots? It's still a real problem, how to responsibly dispose of surplus or broken plastic pots. It's hoped that plant nurseries will be able to receive pots for recycling in future but we're not there yet - Lyonshall Nursery says that discussions are ongoing at national level with the recycling industry to resolve this urgent problem. Some authorities will accept non-black pots for recycling, but Powys unfortunately is not currently able to accept any plastic plant pots for kerbside collection.

So what else can you do? You can offer them on Presteigne Freegle for other gardeners to re-use (www.ilovefreegle.org/presteigne), otherwise you can take them to one of the Household Waste Recycling Centres, in Kington, Leominster or (the closest in Powys) Llandrindod Wells. If anybody knows of any other solution please do let us know by emailing pacdg@icloud.com.

But (black) director Spike Lee didn't have to get creative because this story is for real. It's rich meat, a gift to Lee who rips into the possibilities with acid wit and anger. Our black entryist then uncovers terrorist plots at "America First!" Klan meetings, courtesy of his avatar, a white – Jewish! – fellow cop. And better still, Lee's final coda updates us to the horrors seen at Charlottesville 2017.

The collection consists of 200,000+ negatives, 790 exhibition images, hundreds of prints, scrapbooks full of newspaper cuttings, photo journals, and daily log books of the studio's activities.
