1 Trefor and Margaret Griffiths, Stapleton Castle Court, Ford Street, Presteigne LD8 2LS
This garden was laid out 10 years ago by the current owner, an enthusiastic plantswoman, and is overlooked by the castle remains. Open 10-5. Adults £5 in aid St Michael's Hospice. Children free. Entry includes guided castle walks at 11am and 2.30pm. Tea and cakes available. Plant Stall.

2 Mira Ing, Stapleton Gate, Ford Street, Presteigne LD8 2LW
The new owner of this established garden has renovated and refreshed the planting and added intriguing new structures of her own to the layout.

3 Ruth and Colin Kirkby, Stapleton House, Ford Street, Presteigne LD8 2LW
Bulbs aplenty flourish alongside an abundance of self-sown aquilegia and cowslips, framed by a copper beech archway and ancient oak fencing.

4 Susie Arbuthnott, Garrison House, Church Street, Presteigne LD8 2BU
A lovely, well-stocked town garden with mixed borders, yew hedges and a variety of trees on a site sloping down to the River Lugg.

5 Avriel Reader and Gareth Jones, The Red House Court Garden, St Davids Street, Presteigne LD8 2BP
This beautiful, small town garden is filled with unusual plants - a real plant lovers treat.

6 Chris and Marion Rowlett, 14 Hereford Street, Presteigne LD8 2BP
Tulips, late daffodils, fritillaries, tree blossom and tubs with spring interest.

7 Michael and Saffron Guy, Corton House, Nash, Presteigne, LD8 2LE
A large garden designed by Simon Dorrell on formal lines, with interlocking garden rooms, a double staircase, a pear-tree tunnel and a silver birch grove.

8 Sidney Nolan Trust, The Rodd, Presteigne LD8 2LL
Wild Flower Walks through ancient woodland that is home to diverse flora. Admission charged to visit Gallery and Studio.

9 James and Caroline Weymouth, Upper Tan House, Stansbach, Presteigne, HR6 9LJ
This is a secret garden in an idyllic setting with a stream, woodland, big borders, vegetable garden and a wildflower meadow where snakeshead fritillaries thrive.

10 Catherine and Charlie Janson, Stansbach Barn, Stansbach, Presteigne, HR6 9LG
A plantswoman's garden on a quarter of an acre, stuffed with tulips and other bulbs, unusual perennials and grasses.
