A Christmas message from the Mayor of Presteigne & Norton, James Tennant Eyles.....2016 has been the usual eventful year with many popular community events such as the Street Party for the Queen's Birthday in June, the wonderful Carnival and party on Went's Meadow in July, the internationally renowned Classic Music Festival in August, and the Vintage Sports Car Club Rally in October. The year will be rounded off by a great Christmas Fair shortly in the High Street. These events and the many other attractions in and around the Town mean that Presteigne & Norton is a wonderful place to live and visit. Accommodation providers report an excellent season. Presteigne & Norton Town Council has been successful with a number of projects for the Community this year. It has part-funded and taken over the new Multi Use Games Area and adjacent football field at Went's Meadow. It has successfully obtained grant funding to increase the size of the car park at the allotments, and to install some new equipment at the Wilson Terrace playground. It has part-funded the installation of a defibrillator in Norton and restored two of the benches in the village. It continues to support many organisations in Presteigne and Norton with annual grants.

Overshadowing all this good news, there remains the very serious concern about the future of many of the assets and services in our community, and all across the county, due to the impact of government cutbacks. The Town Council is in ongoing negotiation with Powys County Council to try and find ways to take over assets and preserve services such as our Day Centre, the Library, the Youth Club, Community Support, the cemetery, and a host of other services and facilities. I remain hopeful that the County Council will support the Town Council in its efforts and that these services will be saved.

### More news from the Town Council and the Playground Group...

The Town Clerk has reported that, in the Tesco Bags of Help grant award, we came third in the vote, thanks to everyone who voted! The TC will therefore receive a grant of £8000 for the Little City climbing frame unit which it is hoped will be installed in the Spring.

The Playground Group themselves met recently with the Mayor and Town Clerk, along with someone from the company supplying the new climbing frame. They now have some idea of how much equipment costs and how much they need to fundraise for. They are having a table at the Christmas Street Fayre on Friday 9th selling cakes and biscuits, and a quiz night is being held in the Royal Oak on Tuesday 20th December. Money raised will go to the playground fund. Future events for next year are also being discussed.

### News from the Gardening and Daffodil groups....

As part of the longer-term project to put Presteigne back on the map as a tourist daffodil-centre, the Daffodil group has recently purchased two large troughs and planted them up with old heritage variety daffodils to go on the Judge's Lodging railings.

If any of you have memories from Presteigne's heyday as a specialist daffodil growing area in the 50s and 60s (before the removal of the railway put paid to the trade) and especially if you have knowledge of the old daffodil fields and whether any surviving patches of heritage daffodils remain, then do please get in touch. In the meantime, as well as their efforts in the Shoppers Carpark and at The Scallions, the guerrilla gardeners have been planting donated mixed variety daffodil bulbs in three area of town to provide an extra splash of colour in the Spring - well done everyone involved!

In the Spring, the Daffodil group will be undertaking a survey of Presteigne and Norton to record and map areas of daffodil planting with the aim of increased planting of both ordinary varieties to brighten up the town and to identify suitable areas for planting the old heritage varieties. More on this in a few months time.

### New housing update....

We've just heard from the Town Clerk that work on the new Housing Association development on Knighton Road opposite Wente's Meadow, seems to be further delayed and will not now restart until January, with a completion date of sometime in February. All very frustrating for those people waiting to move in !

And in case you hadn't already heard, the newspapers are reporting (confirmed by the Town Council) that Outline Planning Permission has been granted by the County Council for four new houses in the Clatterbrune House area, despite the original application for six dwellings having been opposed by the Town Council. # An update on the protection of community assets...

At its meeting in November, and as referred to by the Mayor, the Town Council resolved to press on hard in negotiating with Powys County Council to take on buildings and to protect services in the community such as the Assembly Rooms and Library, the Old School and Youth Club, the Drill Hall and Community Support, and the Cemetery, together with a new cemetery extension. We're told there will be a community-wide consultation on the Town Council's proposals, including an open day to explain in more detail, to answer questions and to seek support from the community, and PACDG will be fully involved in this process.
