DAFFY NEWS.... last year at the PACDG Open Day, a small group was formed with the intent of planting daffodils along the verges and many other places in Presteigne to provide a splash of colour following the darkest days of winter to herald the coming of spring, and last September several bags of bulbs were planted in different locations around town by a few willing volunteers. A local historian and writer, Catherine Beale had researched the importance of four daffodil breeders who lived in our area at the end of the 19th century and into twentieth century - Alec Wilson (1868-1953) who alone was responsible for 371 varieties (and donated land now occupied by Wilson Terrace), Dr Nynian Lower (1872-1926), Sir John Arkwright (1872-1954) and Gwendolen Evelyn (d. 1949). Together they produced 470 varieties, some of which are the grand-parents of our modern varieties. The group of "daffodilers" had initially hoped to plant these "heritage" varieties but have settled for planting modern varieties along the byways, and the more special daffodils only at key points around town. This year we would like to plant many more daffodils - as many as possible !!! - and would welcome donations of cash, or bags of bulbs - and people - to help with the planting.
