MAYOR'S MONTHLY REPORT

At the June meeting of the Presteigne and Norton Town Council, the Mayor James Tennant-Eyles was delighted to inform Councillors that Powys County Council have decided not to close the Presteigne Recyling site for the time being, and thus that it will continue to operate run by the Chamber of Trade, with the support of volunteers from the community. It is a much used and popular facility and hopefully will remain open well into the future.

The Mayor also noted that many residents have been concerned about the grass cutting in and around the Town. The County Council have confirmed that the play areas and housing estates will be cut three weekly, the verges inside the 30 mph limit, 3 times per year, and outside the 30 mph once a year, with visibility splays cut more often.

Councillor Beverley Baynham mentioned that referrals to the Day Centre from Powys County Council are reduced and would like to remind everyone that they can and should self refer. Keeping numbers of users up will help to demonstrate the need for the Day Centre.

Finally the Mayor would remind residents that becoming a Friend to the Town Council on Facebook is a very good way of getting Town Council information, and keeping up to date with Town Council news.

A LOCAL STAR.....

Local International Event rider Francesca (Franky) Reid-Warrilow is to represent Great Britain for the second time this year, having been selected to take part in the Nations Cup Event in Aachen, Germany which is taking place from July 13th - 17th, and one of the most respected events on the global calendar. Well done Franky!! The remaining members of the team consist of Izzy Taylor, Laura Collett, and Tina Cook, with the addition of Zara Phillips in the individual Event.

At 26, Franky, a former member of Teme Valley Pony Club, has risen through the ranks rapidly and last year was awarded the 'Bridging the Gap' Mark Todd Scholarship.

She attained an Individual Gold Medal in the 2* European Championship in Holland last year, with GB achieving the Team Silver Medal, and was in Ireland earlier this year as part of the Nations Cup Team, winning Individual 3rd place (Bronze) and a Team Gold Medal.

Franky is based just outside Presteigne in Dolley Green at the family equestrian farm with her partner Arthur Pottier, who is also a respected Event rider. Together they train and sell horses

A MESSAGE FROM THE VOLUNTEER TEAM AT THE BRING SITE.....

As you've probably seen from the notice at the Bring Site, some time ago Presteigne Chamber of Trade took over management of our local recycling centre from Powys County Council (PCC) and in turn receives money from PCC for keeping the site clean. Collections are still contracted, arranged and managed by PCC however. The money received is used for community events, and the site is kept clean daily by a small team of volunteers.

Presteigne COT and the Bring Site volunteer team ask that residents please stick to some simple rules:
- if the green waste skips are full, please take your waste home and come back later when the skips are empty. Green waste containers are scheduled to be emptied three times a week, unless there is a problem

with the collection vehicles.

- dumping loose grass clippings or garden waste behind the skips or leaving bags of garden waste by the skips is unacceptable in any circumstances and it is completely unreasonable to expect volunteers to try and deal with this.
- please DON'T put any soil or wood in the green waste skips. This needs to be taken to Llandegeley to dispose of. Otherwise, topsoil is valuable (so long as it's not full of some nasty weed) and could be offered on Freegle for someone else to collect and use.
- please do NOT leave plastic bags in the green waste containers.
- bags of domestic or green waste and any other stuff dumped at the Bring Site is illegal flytipping. PCC now has a team of dedicated officers who are investigating flytipping and have the right to prosecute offenders. Please contact PCC to report flytipping or dumping of loose garden waste if you see it, on waste.awareness@powys.gov.uk

If you're on a Vodafone contract then, if you haven't already done so, you should complain asap to Vodafone registering the fault (the easiest and least frustrating way is online using Live Chat) clearly saying how long it's been going on, and requesting a refund of your contract fee from that date until it's fixed. The more of us that complain, the better!!

We were contacted by a young Presteigne mum who regularly uses the playground with her children and was complaining about the state of the area and the missing equipment (one major item has been removed and one swing is missing). The playground is the responsibility of Powys County Council so we asked PCC what they were doing about it. The PCC representative made clear that in this time of severe financial constraint, PCC policy was that playground facilities would be maintained and kept safe, and the grassy area cut and strimmed but that, unless only minor repairs were needed, broken equipment would be removed and would not be replaced. Of course that isn't the answer people will want to hear, but that's PCC's stated policy.
