Thanks to all of you who made time to come along. It seems to have been a great success judging by the attendance, with well over 70 local residents crammed into the Youth Centre (The Old School)?on the Thursday night. The lucky ones had chairs while the rest were standing anywhere they could find a space, even in the corridor outside.

They were treated to the launch of the first round of projects from the Community Action Plan by Maggie Taylor-Sanders (PACDG Chair), and an update from our Mayor James Tennant-Eyles on the history and future of local assets with regard to PCC's plans for them. The presentations were warmly received and many relevant questions were put to both speakers.

The following two days saw a steady stream of residents coming in to The Old School to find out what was going on and to offer their support for the different project themes, and hopefully we now have enough volunteers to get all six projects off the ground. Over fifty people signed in favour of the Community Hub proposal and to keep the Library open.

There was also an opportunity to offer general gifts to the community; these ranged from help with mending things, to time weeding pavements, to a donation of £100!

As a bit of fun, visitors posted orange balls into voting buckets for a Straw Poll expressing our support either for retaining some wildflower verges or keeping them all mown and tidy; the 'vote' being 67:7 in favour of the flowers.

Thanks are due to all who made it happen and to all those who came along and made it such a worthwhile event. # TALKING OF RECYCLING, WAS YOUR 'PLASTICS & TINS BIN RETURNED UN-EMPTIED THIS MORNING WITH A POLITE NOTE & LEAFLET FROM POWYS CC?

Maybe it had passed you by, as it did with me I have to confess, that PCC is now no longer able to collect and recycle plastic film from the kerbside. In fact that applies also to the plastics and cans container at the Bring Site (despite it still being labelled for plastic bags!). In addition to the usual plastic stuff listed on your PCC leaflet, stretchy film is now also a no-no. This includes carrier bags, cling film, bubble wrap, and food and veg plastic wrapping. Unfortunately this all now has to join crisp packets, polystyrene packaging, large plastic items, and plastics marked with the 3 and 6 recycling triangles, in your wheelie bin or purple plastic bags.
