**LOOKING FOR (GOOD) NEWS ON THE HIGH SCHOOL JOHN BEDDOES CAMPUS?** ....see their Cyfle Newsletter at https://www.newtown-hs.powys.sch.uk/r/the-cyfle-october. One item is on Welsh Government Education Secretary and Assembly Member for Brecon & Radnorshire Kirsty Williams' recent visit to John Beddoes Campus to discuss student performance on the site since John Beddoes High School closed and students and staff joined Newtown High School. They report that, over the last three years since the schools joined together they have seen all of the main indicators increase on the JBC Campus, particularly the key indicator of 5 A\*-C grades including English & Mathematics which has almost doubled to 67%. Performance at 5A\*-C grades now stands at 100%.

**HOW HAS PRESTEIGNE HIGH STREET COPED WITH RECESSION ?**.....as part of her Ph.D studies at Cardiff University, Nia Richards is currently researching how the financial crisis of 2007/2008 affected the high streets in selected small towns and how resilient they will be to another recession, and Presteigne is included in her study brief.
