Have you seen the spanking new Noticeboards in the alcove at the Library entrance? These were made by Adams Joinery - one for the Town Council to display meeting agenda, minutes and other notices - and one for PACDG to display the latest Community News etc.

The Presteigne CoT has been revitalised....at the recent AGM, Leon Abecasis (from The Salty Dog) was appointed as Chair, with Deputy-Chair Pete Mace (Ducks Nest) and David Tennant Eyles as Treasurer. The Chamber of Trade's focus will be on promoting Presteigne and Norton in all ways including the organisation of local community events. Good news!

News from the Bring Site.....Presteigne Recycling Site. The Mayor and outgoing Chair of the CoT sent this message and thank-you to Bring Site volunteers: I write to thank you, on behalf of the Chamber of Trade, for your support with this project. The Chamber is tremendously grateful for all your efforts in turning out on an ongoing basis, regardless of rain or shine, to maintain the recycling site in such wonderful condition. You may be interested to know that the Chamber has received a net income, after minor expenses on equipment required, of £1953 for 15/16, £2405.01 for 16/17, and £519.48 for the current year to date. This income has helped to fund the work the Chamber does in supporting the community, such as the Queen's Street Party and the Christmas Fair and particularly in its ability to have funded new Christmas Lights for the Town last year. Thank you again, most sincerely, for all your hard work. James Tennant-Eyles.

"Don't miss the bluebells! The bluebells are out in Silia Wood and looking particularly beautiful against a background of fresh green leaves on the trees. The wood is owned by the Woodland Trust and visitors are welcome. The wood is on a steep slope with many steps so not suitable for those with limited mobility, but you can see the bluebells from the bottom path.

Please resist the temptation to pick them - bluebells look much better in their natural setting and don't last long once picked. The entrance is on the right going up Slough Road about 5 minutes walk from the primary school (very limited parking at the woodland entrance)."

Great news for Presteigne - a Welsh Government grant provides money for new cycle paths to/from/between Presteigne schools....In September 2015 Sustrans and Powys CC launched an

initiative to find out what communities would like in terms of cycle routes (these are funded by Welsh Government). Our Town Clerk Tracey Price and Cllr Hilary Marchant met the organisers, and encouraged local residents to fill in the questionnaire. Local teenager Stephanie Seidman test-cycled several local roads and reported back to the council on safety and ease of use; and in 2016 groups from John Beddoes school put forward their suggestions for new cycle routes. Presteigne's enthusiastic response meant our bid was the only one submitted by Powys to Welsh Government - and we've just heard that we have been awarded almost £300,000. The new path will give a safe route for cyclists and walkers going along the bypass from Kings Court to Warden Road, with safe crossing points where needed. Most importantly, work will be done to narrow Slough Road, giving priority to vehicles coming down the hill, and encouraging parents and children to walk or cycle to school rather than clogging up the road with cars. Both schools will receive new bike sheds, and there will be a bike stand at the top of Green End for cyclists going into town.

Recent DPCM notices......[a] Powys Trading Standards have received reports of a Scam telephone call taking place in Powys. The caller claims to be from the Ministry of Justice and tells you that you have only a few days to avoid attending a court hearing and a fine of £5000, but you can avoid this by making a smaller payment to them immediately over the phone. This is a well-established scam which has no link to the HM Courts System or the Ministry of Justice. Do not respond to these calls, If someone rings you and asks for financial information over the phone such as your account details or PIN number, don't provide it.
