.....a new business has opened at No.3 Broad Street so it's a warm Presteigne welcome to Ellie Mathieson - couturier - fashion designer - seamstress. Opening hours: Monday to Friday 8.45am - 5.15pm, Saturday 9.15am - 4pm. Otherwise email pnhc2014@gmail.com & I will respond within 48 hours .....Elan Valley Aqueduct (EVA) has been carrying water for over a hundred years and Severn Trent Water is carrying out work on the EVA to make it fit for the next hundred years. This involves replacing parts of the EVA and the work has now moved on to replace a short section near to Knighton by creating a new underground bypass tunnel which means tunnelling underground from a drive shaft located near to the A488 Pennybont Road just west of Knighton, to a point near the existing well house above the Presteigne Road. Construction of the temporary access road to the west of Knighton has started and they are now digging the shaft from where they will start tunnelling. The massive shaft is over 35m deep and will be completed Spring 2018. Once complete, the tunnel boring machine will be launched and work underground, at times to a depth of 100 meters. During March 2018, work will commence near the existing well house. This includes creating a temporary access opposite the cemetery gates, and an access road at the rear of properties on Presteigne Road. Tunnelling should complete in December 2018 then removal of temporary accesses and roads and restoration of the area to its previous condition will complete by August 2019.
