A message from Transition Presteigne....fed up with excess packaging? Irritated by not being able to recycle it? Sick of the environmental pollution caused when plastic never disappears? The Welsh Government's Waste Hierarchy is REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE and some environmentally-minded County Councillors are now on board. Let's REDUCE the vast quantities of plastics in the waste stream and join the growing UK plastic protest ! A citizens group called **Plastic-Free Powys** have already arranged a shoppers protest at Llandrindod Tesco, and a future event in February at a Newtown supermarket. The action is really simple. They go to a store (with a few leaflets), do a bit of shopping, get to the till and remove all of the plastic on the way through. Bag it up, get the receipts and plastic together from all shoppers afterwards, and hand it back to the duty manager. It is all very peaceful, quite quick and very satisfying ! News from PCC Powys County Council.....

Plans have been accepted to invest nearly £114m in Powys schools over the coming years. The ambitious plans could see major improvements to primary, secondary and special school services across a wide part of the county, as part of a joint Local and Welsh Government 21st Century Programme running from 2019-2025/26.

PCC's Cabinet has approved plans to develop a phased five year programme for the development of new council homes across the county. The intent is to build around 250 properties in the next five years. More than £6m will be spent with Powys companies for housing stock improvement.

The Welsh Government is considering a support package for Powys to help it respond to the recent CSSIW recommendations (Care & Social Services Inspection Wales). The news has been welcomed by the Council Leader Rosemarie Harris, who wrote to Welsh Government Ministers last week asking them to exercise their powers under the Local Government (Wales) Measure 2009 to provide statutory support to PCC.

If you need to get rid of things that can't be recycled or re-used via Freegle, or won't be accepted at the Powys or Hereford Household Waste Centres, note that things have changed again at the private JPR Waste Recycling Centre at Llandegley - they will still take most things, but now charge for everything at the rate of £150 per ton, with a minimum charge of £20. JPR also provides skip hire and sells a range of new, recycled and reclaimed products. Open 10am to 4pm. They say they recycle over 85% of all the waste they handle and are on the way to achieving a zero waste to landfill status by favouring waste-to-energy for residual wastes that can't be recycled.
