Going on a litter-pick is good fun, very sociable and rewarding, and all equipment - grabbers, hoops & bags, and hi-vis vests - is provided. As a trial, we will supplement the regular litter-picks with a paid volunteer dealing with the heavier work of pavement/gutter weeding and sweeping, and this cleaning work will be funded from a small initial grant from the Town Council. Encouraging news from the Judge's Lodging....as the charity moves towards taking the building over entirely from the County Council, the Welsh Government has shown its support of this immersive award-winning Victorian museum through its new Transition Grant Programme and are funding £120,000 towards a £146,000 capital project with three aims: Firstly, work will be done to stabilise the roof structure of this Grade 2-star building, with new lead-work, slate repairs and a repainting of its front facade, making the building watertight for the future and sprucing up its appearance to visitors and residents of the town alike. Then a new, enhanced Shop and Tourist Information Point, creating a more welcoming and accessible space for everyone. Finally, a new audio system to replace the much-loved, but sadly no longer functioning Walkman system, used to run the popular character-based audio tour for visitors. As the local authority moves away from supporting the museum, staff are having to work hard to raise funds to keep the building moving forwards. To this end, they have just opened up a pop-up Welsh Tearoom, with locally sourced teas, coffees, drinks and cakes, all served in vintage china - <u>open Tuesdays to Sundays and Bank Holidays 10am to 5pm</u> during the summer. The museum has an active volunteering programme so, if you fancy helping The Judge's Lodging, do pop by, find out more, sign up to be part of the team...or even buy yourself a nice cuppa!

'My Generation' is a free MIND programme to help those of us over-50 look after our well-being together. Cycle path news from PCC..."the active travel facilities in Presteigne will be expanded after the Welsh Government agreed to provide a £400,000 grant. The latest grant for Presteigne follows on from the success of the town's 'Safe Route in Communities' project, which was completed earlier this year, and has seen more residents now deciding to walk or cycle using the new paths rather than driving a vehicle. The Active Travel Fund is part of the Welsh Government funding commitment to boost levels of active travel across Wales. The Town Council has been supporting the work of County Council Officers and Cty Cllr. Baynham to apply for this further funding for Presteigne. Plans are being developed and full draft designs will be presented for consideration in due course. Thank you to both Officers and Cllr. Baynham for their hard work on the project."
