SCAM ALERT

...from PAVO. Criminals are exploiting the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown measures to steal from and defraud older people throughout Wales, using sophisticated techniques to get individuals to part with money, share personal information or buy goods or services that do not exist. Covid-19 related scams that have been identified include:

- Online shopping scams where people have ordered face masks, hand sanitiser, testing kits and other products that have never arrived.
- Victims receiving a call with an automated message purporting to be from the government, which states that all individuals now need to wear a face mask when they leave their home.
 The message tells the victim to press 1 in order to purchase a mask.
- Text messages purporting to be from HMRC advising individuals they can get a tax refund of up to £400. The message includes a link to a fake website where people believe they can check their eligibility for a refund.
- Other Covid-19 scams include requests for donations from individuals and fake charities, phishing scams offering grant money from the World Health Organisation, and fake bills being emailed to customers demanding payment.

...and beware fake Work Quotation emails from 'Lesley Taylor' (or whoever!) with a request to click a One Drive link to see the plans. Just DELETE.

...from Marches Grow Local. The 'Marches Grow Local' initiative has been started with the help of 'Tamar Grow Local', a very successful community-run project in Devon. We are currently in the exploration phase to see if there's a need and the demand to help join up the people with spare land with those who want to grow (or keep bees, or help others), with those who can teach best practice that will enhance our soil and increase biodiversity while also helping to sequester carbon, all in the aim of producing good, nutritious local food. The absolute key to this is that whatever we create is there to support existing local producers and help others who want to become producers to do so. What is the questionnaire aiming to achieve? The purpose of the questionnaire is to gain a deeper understanding of how our local Marches food system operates. We have been greatly inspired by Tamar Grow Local in Devon and would like to find out if there's the appetite here to create a similar food network. We need as many responses as possible to determine how best to take this initiative forward, so we would be extremely grateful if you could spare 5-10 minutes to complete it and, if possible,

- ...from Powys Teaching Health Board. The NHS Test Trace Protect Service in Powys is already helping to stop the spread of Coronavirus in the county. During its first two weeks of operation the county's Contact Tracing Team, developed in partnership by Powys County Council and Powys Teaching Health Board, has made contact with 19 people who have tested positive for coronavirus. - ...from Powys CC. School-based emergency childcare hubs are to close later this month as schools in Powys prepare to re-open before the end of the summer term, the county council has said. Powys County Council is working with school leaders across the county to enable schools to re-open for a limited number of learners each day as part of 'Check in, Catch Up, Prepare for summer and September' - the Welsh Government's next phase for schools in Wales which will start on Monday, June 29. As part of the preparations, the school-based emergency childcare hubs will close on Wednesday, June 24. For Thursday 25 and Friday 26 June, childcare will be offered by individual schools across Powys for their own pupils between 8:30am and 4:30pm. This will be for the children of key workers and the vulnerable learners who are currently accessing childcare. From Monday, June 29, schools in the county will make childcare provision for the children of key workers who have used the emergency childcare hubs between the opening of the hubs in March and the end of May. This provision will be on school days only from 8:30am to 4:30pm from Monday, Additionally, the children of schools' staff will be able to join the childcare facility to allow their parents to work in schools. Vulnerable learners will also be able to access schools for the usual school day, and they will be informed by their schools. For primary-aged children of key workers (who used the hubs between March and May) and the children of schools' staff, parents will still need register online at https://en.powys.gov.uk/ emergency hubs until the end of the summer term. Other learners will access as many days as schools are able to facilitate but parents and carers are being reminded that no more than 30 percent of pupils will be present at school at any one time. Schools will determine the number of days and inform parents about which children will be able to attend on each day. School transport will be provided to those who usually use that service - with careful social distancing put in place on transport. For the period of the schools' summer holidays, the council is currently exploring options to provide childcare for school-aged children of key workers.
