...from County Clir. Beverley Baynham. Today a mass of cones will be arriving in our High Street to cordon off a section of each side of the pavement to widen them due to social distancing now non-essential shops are allowed to open.

All the car parking spaces are being removed except for the disabled. Deliveries etc will still be allowed to park, but will obviously have to move cones. After leading a fairly successful campaign we now have some free parking in the car park to compensate (originally it was tough luck!). It is a Powys County Council decision to implement these measures with Welsh Government funding from a grant.

Interestingly there are some people in the community who would like to see the High Street pedestrianised completely, something that I am not in agreement with. In theory it sounds lovely but in practical terms it is not.

But, for now we have a temporary measure that is being introduced and I would imagine will have to be changed in the coming days.

PCC have said they'll work with the local councillor and Town Council to make it work, so here's your chance. Let me know what you would like to see please. There's not much point in hoards of posts telling me to get rid. What we need is constructive criticism. If we can make alternative suggestions then we can make changes. Although saying that, if it's a complete disaster and we can demonstrate footfall in the local shops has reduced dramatically then we would have a good reason to request the scheme is removed.

From 6 July, we hope to change the rules to let two households join together to create an 'extended household'. *(ed. by this same date, the Welsh Government have said they are hoping to lift the 5mile travelling restriction)*. Everyone in the extended household can act as if they live in one household – so, go into each other's homes and not need to stay 2 metres apart. This includes staying over, childcare and help with other caring responsibilities. To reduce the spread of coronavirus, you can only create an extended household with one other household.
