**Many congratulations to Bill Higginson MBE, retired county cricketer, umpire and MCC coach, in this year's Queen's Honours List.** Bill says “This came about as the result of a nomination by a small group of guys and girls with whom I had been volunteering for almost twenty years for a Charity called the British Association for Cricketers with Disabilities (BACD) initially as the Welsh Team Coach/Manager, then as a BACD Committee member, I became Chairman and ultimately their President. Last year we handed the whole operation over to the England & Wales Cricket Board (ECB) the National Governing Body. We had started with three counties, Shropshire, Lancashire and Wales and progressed by encompassing 32 county teams, playing in four annual national competitions. They comprise players with either physical (P.D) or learning (L.D) disabilities. Their attitude being at all levels is “*we are cricketers who just happen to have a disability*”. We have been so fortunate to play a part in their encouragement, development and successes. From those early beginnings we can now boast full English International teams who have toured abroad in India, South Africa, Dubai, Australia and hosted in England for the past eleven years. My own introduction came through a Llandrindod Wells club player, Simon Hickton, who now lives in New Zealand. The Wales squad were short of a coach one weekend at Christ College Brecon and he persuaded me to come along to assist with their indoor practice. I was hooked from that moment. Their eagerness, determination and humour was amazing. I thought my lifetime cricket career had come to an end until I was privileged to share some time with these, in my book, very special players. All this went together to land this Honour which I shall always consider as a shared experience.

## SCAM ALERT

**...from Nick about a Penalty Charge scam.** *“Just received an e-mail purporting to be from the Home Office, inviting me to stump up a Fixed Charge Penalty. Just in case any of your readers receive one too, I’m pretty sure that this is a scam a) because my car was parked outside our house in Church Street when the “offence” is alleged to have taken place, b) because of the use of the phrase “at the date and time started below” (instead of “time stated”) and c) North Yorkshire Police warned of a similar scheme in September.”*

**..and about a DVLA scam.** Drivers are currently being warned about a convincing DVLA scam email that seeks to trick you into thinking you haven’t paid for your vehicle tax. The scam involves drivers receiving an email that informs them that their latest vehicle tax payment has failed. The email is professionally worded and tells you that “some of the billing details associated with you might have expired or were otherwise changed”. You are then encouraged to click on a link to “update and verify” their billing details. You are then also warned that if you fail to pay your vehicle tax on time, you can be fined up to £1,000, or that your details could be passed on to a debt collection agency. Others say something like “...our automated routine check has found some irregularities in your current profile which indicates that the information you have given is no longer accurate or up to date” and then threatens “If you will not update your account details we may suspend your DVLA account.” Of course, clicking on any links would allow scammers to steal your details. *The DVLA says “We never send emails that ask you to confirm your personal details or payment information.”* If you’ve received one of these emails, do not click on any links, forward the email to report it as above, and then delete. *(ed. thanks for all this information, Nick)*

**...from Christine.** *“Just received a scam text from +447857071577 purporting to come from HSBC saying .... ‘Dear HSBC Customer. We have detected a new device on your account. To keep your account secure, please follow: <https://devicexxx.com/hsbc>’. We’ve reported this to HSBC and by text to 7726.”*

*(ed. apart from not addressing by name, the IP address shows this is a scam - ignore everything after the backslash (i.e. hsbc) and you can see the website is ‘<https://device8848>’, not HSBC).*

**Report scam texts** directly to your mobile phone provider note the originating mobile number, copy the scam text and then send a report text to 7726 quoting the number and pasting in the text. All mobile operators now use this short code text which is free of charge, and all operators work together to collate information in real time from the 7726 code.

**...from the Welsh Government.** We're giving councils powers to crack down on pavement parking, something 83% of us in Wales see as a real problem. With more of us choosing to walk than ever, we want to create an environment that is pedestrian-friendly and puts people before cars. See <https://gov.wales/welsh-government-give-councils-powers-crack-down-pavement-parking>. The Welsh Government is to give Local Authorities the power to fine people parking on pavements. The current law is not as clear as it could be", said Deputy Transport Minister, Lee Waters MS, who set up the taskforce. "There is no specific offence of parking on pavements, and though the Police can enforce the existing criminal offence of causing 'unnecessary obstruction of any part of the highway', it is rarely enforced", he added.
