In case you missed the Geminid meteor shower on December 13/14 then the remaining astronomical highlight of the month surely has to be the conjunction between Jupiter and Saturn, on Monday December 21 - their closest angular encounter since 1623 and the best opportunity for viewing since 1226. Keen observers might have noticed the duo gradually closing up and 'hovering' over the bypass bridge when looking uphill from Green End not long after sunset. Good binoculars will easily tease out Jupiter's main moons and possibly Titan, the largest moon of Saturn. A modest telescope should just reveal Jupiter's equatorial belts and the famous rings of Saturn. Sources: <u>Spaceweather.com</u> and Astronomy Now magazine.

...from Jane at the KeepWalesSafe Campaign about contacting your local pharmacy as your first port of call for minor health concerns this winter to help Keep Wales Safe. Around 350,000 people get help from a community pharmacy every day in Wales and access services such as advice and treatment for minor conditions, free NHS flu vaccinations, emergency contraception and the Stop Smoking service. Patients are also able to access the Common Ailments Service at pharmacies, as an alternative to seeing their GP and without the need for a prescription, as pharmacists are able to diagnose and treat a range of common ailments such as head lice, indigestion, back pain, eye infections and threadworms. We don't always need a visit to the GP – we can often access many of the same treatments directly on our high street. Pharmacies are a key service if you are feeling unwell or have minor health concerns. NHS 111 Wales is also available, all day and every day. GPs are busy but if you are worried about persistent symptoms, please don't let your needs go unchecked - and remember, if you have Covid symptoms no matter how mild, self-isolate & book a test. Thousands of people use the NHS 111 Wales symptoms.

...from Powys Teaching Health Board. Our pharmacy elves are working very hard to make sure everyone has their prescriptions this Christmas. #HelpUsHelpYou by allowing at least 7 days between ordering and collecting.

...from the Welsh Government. Our £340m support package has been designed to get help to businesses quickly. Many bars and restaurants will receive between £3k and £5k before Christmas, with more to come in the new year. This will help protect many more jobs and livelihoods. ...from Powys CC about Avian Flu. New measures to help protect poultry and captive birds are being introduced across Wales, England, and Scotland following a number of UK cases of avian influenza in both wild and captive birds. New housing measures, which come into force on 14 December, mean that it will be a legal requirement for all bird keepers to keep their birds indoors and to follow strict biosecurity measures in order to limit the spread of disease.
