**BREAKING NEWS from the BBC! ... Wales will go into a level four lockdown, the highest possible, from 28 December**, with some sectors closing during the Christmas period. Non-essential shops will close in Wales from the end of trading on Christmas Eve, with the country going into a stay-at-home lockdown four days later. Close-contact services, such as hair salons, will also have to shut before Christmas, First Minister Mark Drakeford has announced. All hospitality will close at 18:00 GMT on Christmas Day. It follows an agreement by UK nations to continue to allow three households to mix between 23 and 27 December. However, Mr Drakeford told a press conference his government was advising only two households to meet in a single "bubble". The situation in Wales was "extremely serious", he said, with one in five people testing positive for the virus. More than 2,100 people, "equivalent to five full general hospitals" were being treated in the NHS with Covid, he said. [Under the recently published plans](#) people will be expected to stay at home with travel only allowed for essential reasons.

All Household Waste Recycling Centres will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day (Friday 25 December, Saturday 26 December and Friday 1 January). Order now for delivery March 2021 via @WoodlandTrust. Schools across the UK, plus nurseries, colleges, universities and outdoor learning centres, all kinds of different groups such as resident associations, sports clubs, parish councils, scouts, guides and many more. You don't need to belong to an official organisation. You could even set up a group for the purpose of planting, but you must be not-for-profit. The most important thing is that your group is willing to take on the planning, planting and care of the saplings.

**...from Powys Teaching Health Board about Care Home COVID vaccinations.** PTHB is committed to vaccinating care home residents as quickly and safely as possible. Unfortunately however, due to the limitations of transporting the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine, it has not yet been possible to bring the vaccine to care homes (*because of the rural nature of Powys*). Instead, care home staff are invited to attend Mass Vaccination Centres to help protect those who live in care homes. Once other vaccines become available, PTHB will then be able to bring the vaccine to care homes in order to start vaccinating residents as soon as possible. PTHB will be in touch with care home managers once they are able to schedule in vaccinations. Please do not contact your GP regarding COVID vaccinations at this time.

**...from Arrowfield Vets. Update on pet travel to the EU from 1st January.** The UK has been granted 'Part 2 listed status' which means that there are new rules in place for travelling to the EU with your pets. The Pet Passport will no longer be valid after 1st January 2021. Instead, an Animal Health Certificate (AHC) needs to be issued by a vet. AHCs are only valid for: 10 days after the date of issue for entry to the EU - A single trip for entry to the EU - Onward travel within the EU and re-entry to GB for 4 months after the date of issue.
