**NHS Volunteer Appeal in Wales.** It's become clear that the widely-publicised and very successful NHS GoodSam Volunteer appeal applies only to people living in England. That could be a complication in border areas like ours. Have you tried to volunteer through GoodSam but been rejected because you have a Powys postcode even though you're on the English side of the border ? Please let us know.

A Welsh Government spokesman said "Councils will coordinate volunteer input for those people who want to volunteer. That information will be shared with the voluntary sector and indeed the NHS". **In Powys, willing volunteers can register on the Volunteering Wales website [www.powysvolunteering-wales.net](http://www.powysvolunteering-wales.net).** The Powys Association of Voluntary Organisations (PAVO) is co-ordinating formal health and care volunteering opportunities identified by Powys County Council and Powys Teaching Health Board on behalf of the Community Sector Emergency Response Team (C-SERT) which has been set up to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in communities in Powys.

**Information for self-employed residents from a local accountant:**

"This is what we know about the new self-employed income support scheme announced yesterday:

- An 80% **taxable** grant based on the average monthly profits over the last 3 years up to £2,500
- Initially available for 3 months
- Can claim this and continue to work
- Only for those with trading profits up to £50,000
- Majority of income must come from self-employment
- Have to have been self employed for the tax return 2018/19
- If you haven't filed your tax return for 2018/19 you have 4 weeks to submit
- No need to apply as HMRC will contact you directly using existing information to check potential eligibility
- Grants will be paid in a single lump sum covering all 3 months starting to be paid beginning of June
- For help right now you can claim Universal Credits and immediate payments are being made
- Directors of Limited Companies who are paid a salary and dividends do not qualify but will be covered for their salary by the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme"

(Editor's note: This guidance has been given in good faith by a local accountant - thank you Elsa - but it will be a few days until the official guidance on this is published, and self-employed people should check requirements and procedures with their own accountant.
