You need the following:

- * Card and PIN to check balance, withdraw cash, deposit cash
- * Card and pre-printed slip to pay in cash
- * Pre-printed slip and bank-branded envelope to pay in cheques.

...from PCC. Latest news: Enforcement action has been taken against three Powys businesses after they failed to comply with Covid-19 restrictions and refused to close, the county council has said. Despite the latest measures, the businesses have continued to trade so a range of enforcement action has been carried out including issuing prohibition notices and fixed penalty notices. "We were left with no option but to take enforcement action against these three premises after they continued to ignore the measures. We will continue to support the county's businesses where we can during these unprecedented times but will take the appropriate action against those who disregard these vital measures and put people's lives at risk."
