Our local pharmacy can offer advice and provide some over-the-counter and prescription medicines free of charge, without the need to see your GP for the following treatments: acne, athlete's foot, chicken pox, cold sores, colic, conjunctivitis, bacterial eye infections, constipation, dermatitis, diarrhoea, dry eyes, haemorrhoids, hay fever, head lice, indigestion, ingrowing toenails, intertrigo, mouth ulcers, nappy rash, oral thrush, ringworm, scabies, sore throat, teething, threadworms, vaginal thrush, verruca.

- ...from Emma Lilley, Brecon & Radnor branch of CPRW (the Campaign for the Protection of Rural Wales). Some of you may know of Bute Energy's plans for our hills and be comfortable with them but CPRW is starting to realise that lots of people don't and won't be! For those who haven't been following the project, Bute is planning three wind farms for Mid-Wales consisting of 65 turbines up to 220m high and a grid connection corridor of more than 300 pylons running 60 miles all the way to Carmarthen. The planning application for the first one, Nant Mithil Energy Park (covering Radnor Forest), is due later this year.

- Saturday 15 June at 10am-3pm, Fforest Inn, Llanfihangel Nant Melan, at the A44/A481 junction Drop-in session to help with making effective submissions to Bute (as part of their planning consultation, which ends 24 June) and general information organised by Re-think (https://www.rethink.wales)
- Monday 17 June at 7pm, Metropole, Llandrindod Wells. Public meeting organised by Fay Jones, Conservative candidate for Brecon & Radnorshire
- Go to https://www.brecon-and-radnor-cprw.wales/?page\_id=2931 to see a map showing the location and impact of the proposed wind farms. The turbines will be visible for miles and from many of our favourite walks from Offa's Dyke paths to the Whimble. They really will change our landscape for ever. CPRW's view is that the location of our wind farms needs a much more nuanced approach. It supports renewable energy but draws the line at a proposal for three farms built less than 2.5 km apart that will overwhelm our landscape of small hills and valleys and destroy countless habitats in the process. Wales will need off-shore wind in any case to meet its 2035 targets so why let Bute industrialise our hills?
